More than a score to WIN this season

Wollongong's WIN Stadium will light up this Monday for the NRL season opener with two new red Variable Message Sign (VMS) scoreboards from Computronics installed at both ends of the ground.

The WIN Stadium opener between St George Illawarra Dragons and Gold Coast Titans is expected to host a capacity crowd of 20,000-plus spectators with the new signs offering more than the on-field scores.
